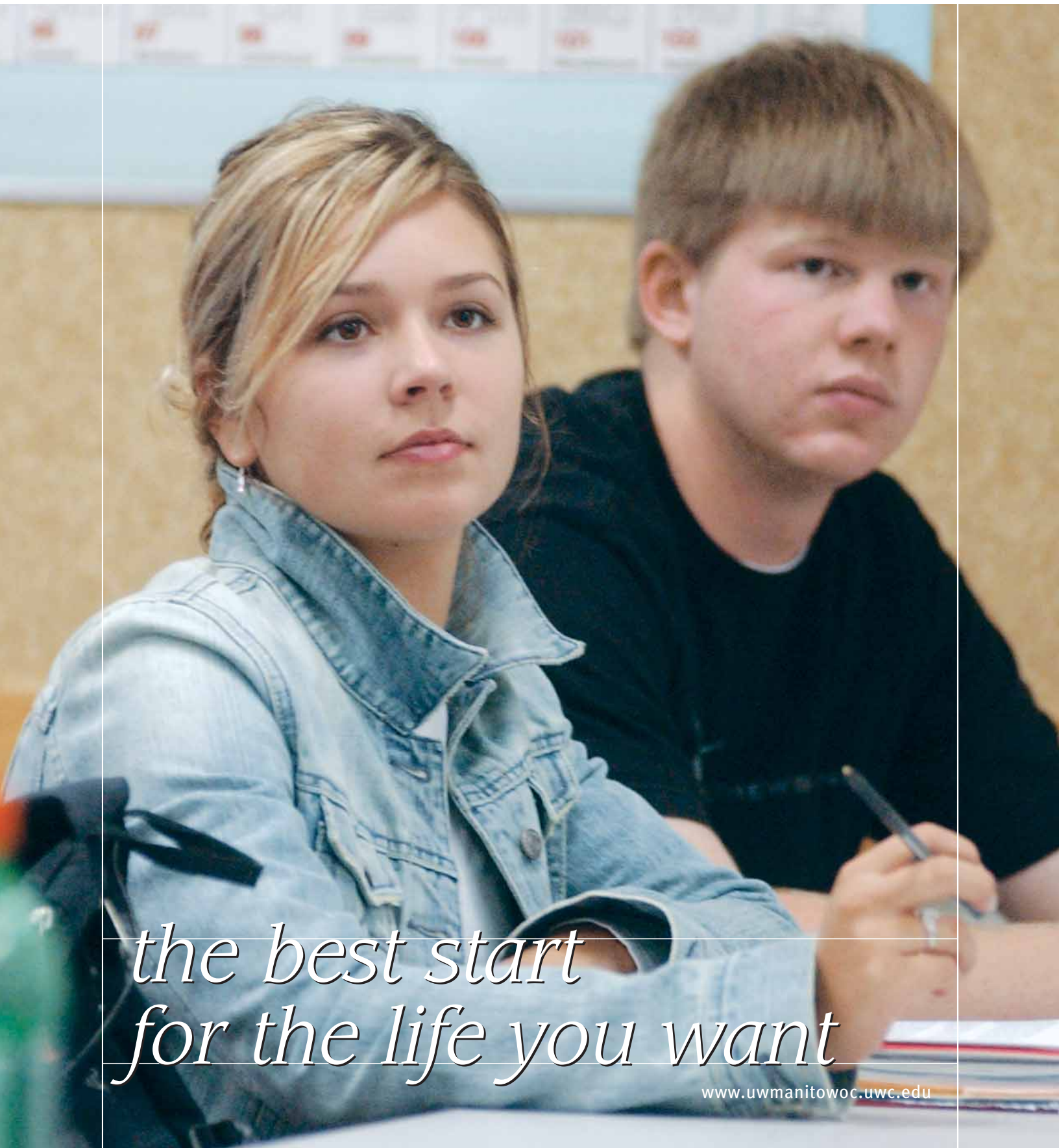

## How do you earn a bachelor's degree?

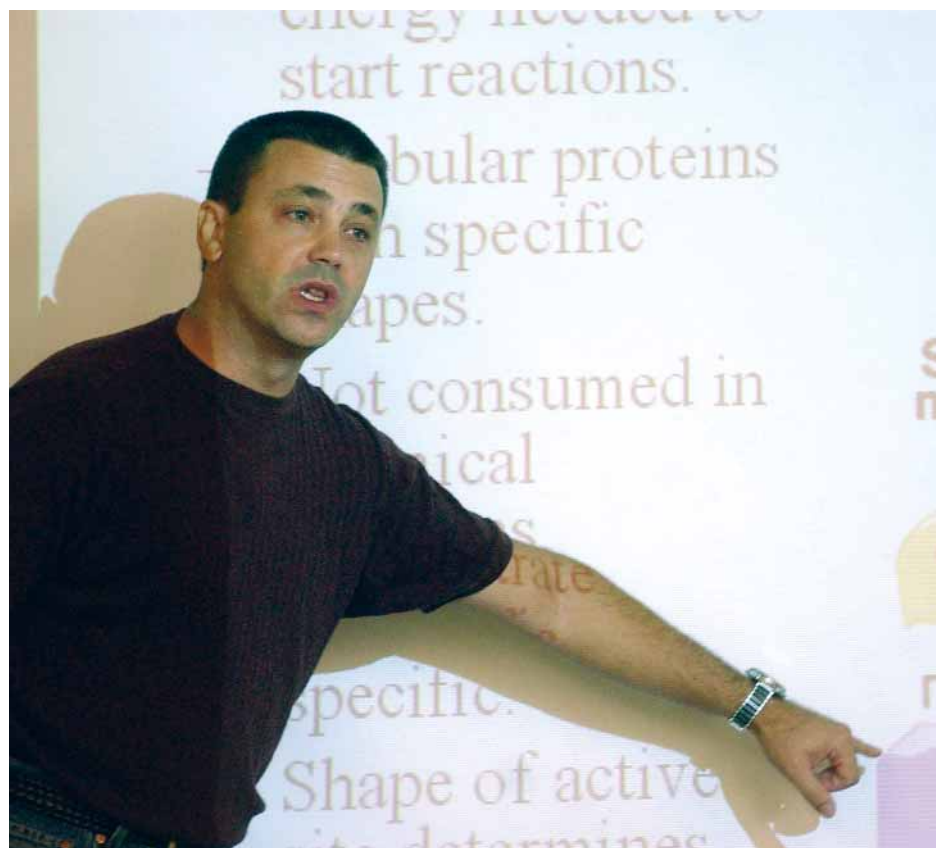
You meet course requirements in two main categories.

### General education requirements offered at UW-Manitowoc.

- Includes English and math proficiency courses, plus courses from the natural sciences, social sciences and humanities.
- Normally completed during the freshman and sophomore years.
- Many UW-Manitowoc students mark the completion of the first half of a bachelor's degree by earning the Associate of Arts and Science degree (see page 5).

### Major program of study.

- Majority of coursework for most majors is completed during the junior and senior years.
- Many degree programs require some prerequisite courses before admission into a particular major. UW-Manitowoc offers many of these prerequisites.



- With **small classes** (average size is 25 students) and plenty of one-on-one attention, the transition to college is less stressful.
- The best start doesn't come with a big price tag. We offer the **lowest tuition in the UW System**.
- **Professors are approachable.** In addition to being great teachers and scholars, they are known for going the extra mile to help students succeed during the critical first two years of college.
- Our **"Engaging Students in the First Year"** program will help you learn what it takes to be successful in college and will connect you with resources and classmates during your first days on campus.
- A **strong curriculum** provides a solid foundation for success in future academics and careers.
- **Classes are held days and evenings** throughout the year.
- **Advisors are readily available** to help plan your class schedule, explain transfer options and examine career choices.
- When you're ready to move on, the **UW Guaranteed Transfer Program ensures admission** to the UW four-year campus of your choice including UW-Madison.

*Typically about 550 students are enrolled at UW-Manitowoc. You will receive instruction in small classes taught by highly qualified faculty (the majority have a Ph.D. or equivalent terminal degree in their field).*



# *think you can't*

The best start doesn't come with a big price tag.

Enjoy the **lowest tuition** in the UW System when you attend UW-Manitowoc.

- Live at home a year or two and **save up to \$10,000 on room and board** expenses. Many students actually leave UW-Manitowoc without any debts.
- Attending two years at UW-Manitowoc **saves you almost \$1,700** in tuition compared to the other four-year UW campuses, and **over \$4,000** compared to the Madison and Milwaukee campuses.
- Almost half (47%) of the financial aid offered is in the form of **grants and scholarships** that don't have to be paid back.
- **Keep your current job** while you attend classes or see if you are eligible for a work-study job.
- **Only 33% of UW Colleges students** use student loans compared to 52% at UW four-year campuses.

Sure it's fun to buy CDs, clothes, a car, but those material things don't last. Your education will last a lifetime. Any way you look at it, UW-Manitowoc is an excellent value.

## *scholarships*

*Through the generous support of the UW-Manitowoc Foundation, Inc., area civic clubs and service organizations, businesses, faculty and staff and individuals committed to higher education, there are many scholarships available to qualified UW-Manitowoc students in the following categories:*

- **New Students** – Incoming new freshmen who have not yet earned college credit.
- **Non-traditional Students** – Students over the age of 22.
- **Continuing Students** – Students who have already earned some college credits at UW-Manitowoc.

*No matter what your area of interest, there may be a scholarship for you. Those available cover a wide variety of areas including, but not limited to:*

- **Fine Arts** – for music, art and theater students.
- **Specific majors** – for students excelling in science, math, business and history.

- **Transferring students** – for students transferring to a particular institution such as UW-Madison, UW-Green Bay, UW-Milwaukee, UW-Oshkosh, and Marquette University.

- **General Scholarships** – for students in good standing who are members of a club or organization, or for those hard working individuals with a solid academic record and financial need.

*Applications for most scholarships must be completed by April 1. Applications are reviewed by the campus' Academic Actions and Awards Committee. The scholarships are presented at the annual Honors Convocation Ceremony held in May for the coming academic year.*

## How to pay for college

If you need help with the costs of attending college, financial aid is available. Most aid is based on financial need and is designed to help meet the difference between the cost of college and your (or your family's) ability to pay.

To find out if you are eligible for financial aid, you need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Be sure to write in UW Colleges code #003897.

You may apply for financial aid anytime after January 1 preceding the academic year that you plan to attend college. If you have submitted all forms by April 15, you will be given funding priority.

There are four forms of financial aid:

- GRANTS are awarded based on financial need and do not require repayment.
- SCHOLARSHIPS are awarded to students based on academic achievement or

other criteria; financial need is sometimes taken into account. Scholarships do not require repayment. See opposite page for more details on scholarships available at UW-Manitowoc.

- LOANS may be offered to students and parents at low interest rates. Loans are considered a form of financial aid and must be repaid. In most cases repayment of student loans does not begin until after graduation or a student leaves school.
- STUDENT EMPLOYMENT may be offered in the form of work-study. Work-study is awarded based on need and will provide the opportunity for employment during the academic year. This work is part-time, and often limited to a specific number of hours per week.

## Guaranteed Transfer Program

The Guaranteed Transfer Program makes it possible for students to begin their education as new freshmen at UW-Manitowoc and be guaranteed admission as a junior to any of the UW four-year campuses including UW-Madison.

After fulfilling certain credit and grade point average requirements, you will transfer with all the rights and privileges as those who began their education at the four-year campus.

## Credit transfer

How will your credits transfer? The answer is just a click away. The Transfer Information System (TIS) website at [www.uwsa.edu/tis](http://www.uwsa.edu/tis) makes the transfer process understandable by showing:

- How the courses you take at UW-Manitowoc will transfer to any campus in the UW System.
- Which courses to take to fulfill specific requirements at your intended transfer campus.
- Which schools offer your intended major.

UW Colleges is fully accredited by the Higher Learning Commission and is a member of the North Central Association. Therefore, credits earned at UW-Manitowoc will also be accepted by private colleges and universities in Wisconsin and throughout the country.

# *a college degree is a credential that lasts a lifetime*

At UW-Manitowoc, you acquire a strong academic foundation for future success.

## Associate degree

If you are undecided about a major, an Associate of Arts and Science (AAS) degree can be particularly valuable, since it fulfills the University of Wisconsin's system-wide general education requirements for freshmen and sophomores. Students can also pursue this degree as their personal foundation for their major at any UW System campus.

For those who are not going on to complete a four-year degree, the associate degree can serve as the foundation for lifelong learning, leadership and responsibility. Completing the degree demonstrates proficiency in mathematics and English and knowledge from a wide variety of courses including humanities, social sciences and natural sciences.

The requirements for receiving a UW Colleges Associate of Arts and Science degree are:

1. Successful completion of a minimum of 60 credits, with at least 24 of the 60 credits completed within the UW Colleges, or 12 of the last 24 credits completed within the UW Colleges.
2. Fulfillment of the UW Colleges General Education Requirements.
3. A student must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher earned at the UW Colleges and 2.0 overall GPA in credits applied towards the Associate of Arts and Science degree.
4. Students must be enrolled at a UW Colleges campus during the semester in which the degree requirements are completed or have earned 60 degree credits prior to transferring from the UW Colleges to a baccalaureate degree-granting campus.

## Bachelor's degree

To receive a bachelor's degree, most students must earn a minimum of 120 degree credits. After getting your best start at UW-Manitowoc, you can complete your bachelor's degree by:

- Transferring to a UW four-year campus or any other college or university.
- Staying at UW-Manitowoc and taking advantage of the collaborative degree program with UW-Milwaukee, which offers the following bachelor's degrees on our campus:
  - B.A. in Organizational Administration
  - B.A. in Communication
  - B.A. in Information Resources

UW-Manitowoc has also teamed-up with UW-Oshkosh, UW-Sheboygan and Lakeshore Technical College to offer a Bachelor of Science-Nursing Degree Completion Program for registered nurses.

# apply to UW-Manitowoc

A step-by-step guide.

## Nervous about the application process? Don't be.

It's a lot simpler than you might think.  
**Just follow these steps.**

1. Complete and sign the UW System Application for Undergraduate Admission with a \$35 processing fee. **We strongly encourage you to apply online at [www.apply.wisconsin.edu](http://www.apply.wisconsin.edu).** Or you can find a paper application at your high school guidance office or at our campus.
2. Submit an official copy of your high school transcript. To be admitted you will need a high school diploma or GED, and have taken a minimum of 17 high school credits including:
  - 4 English credits
  - 4 elective credits
  - 3 social science credits
  - 3 math credits
  - 3 natural science credits
3. Send your ACT or SAT (American College Test or Scholastic Aptitude Test) scores to us. (The ACT or SAT is not required of students over 21 or special students.)
4. Apply for financial aid. We'll be happy to help, if you'd like to stop by or call us. You can find the FAFSA form (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at your guidance office, at our campus or at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
5. After you're admitted, take placement tests in English and math to determine which classes you'll need to take.
6. Meet with a UW-Manitowoc advisor, who can help you plan your classes, discuss your transfer goals and talk about your expectations.
7. Participate in the new freshmen orientation.
8. Register for classes. As a UW-Manitowoc student you'll be able to register for classes online.

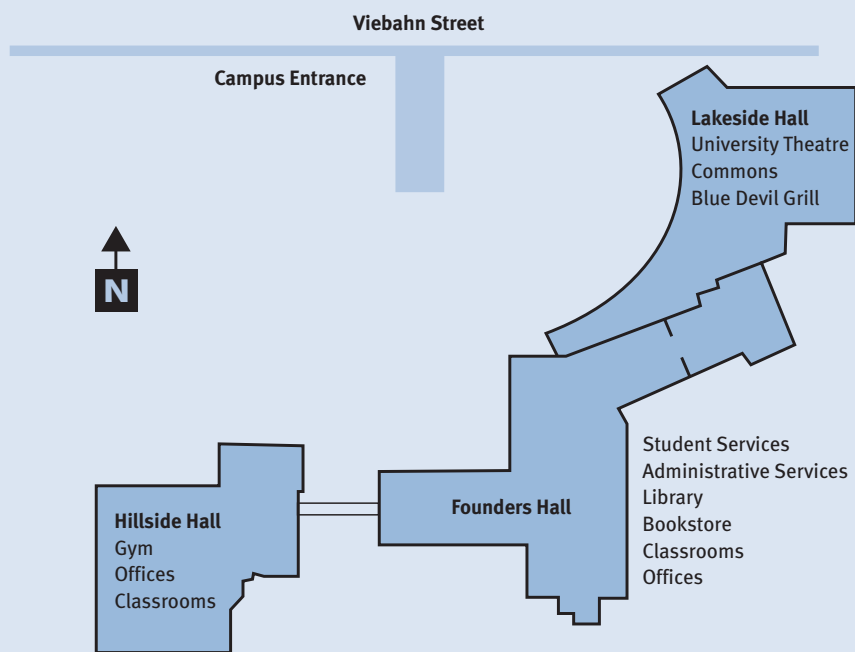
